## Lenten Journey – 40 days

Our Lenten Journey begins this week with Ash Wednesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March, when there are two Masses with distribution of Ashes at 9.15am and 7.30pm. It is a day of fasting and abstinence, meaning refraining from eating meat and drinking alcohol.

On Ash Wednesday, receiving the Ashes, reminds us that Lent is a time of repentance. The word repentance comes from the Greek word meaning ‘Change of mind’. To change, to move away from sin, to be genuinely sorry for our sins, to ask for God’s forgiveness, putting Christ firmly at the centre of our lives – to become ‘Christ-Centered’.

The 40 days of Lent leads us towards Holy Week and Easter, when we remember Christ’s Passion, Death and Resurrection. Easter Sunday is the most important day for us as Christians.

During Lent let us avail of the opportunities offered to deepen our prayer life and our relationship with Christ. For example coming to Mass during the week, spending time in adoration before the Blessed sacrament on a Thursday morning, joining the prayer group on Thursday evening at 7.30pm and participating in the Stations of the Cross on Friday’s at 7pm with a Mass that follows.

Let us be resolved to make the most of this Lenten season – prayer, fasting and works of charity, thus ready to celebrate with joy the Lord’s resurrection.
