Third Sunday of Ordinary Time Year A 22nd January 2023

'The Lord is my light and my help'

Pope Francis has designated today as the **Sunday of the Word of God**, when we are reminded that the Lord is in constant dialogue with his people through his Holy Word. Let us ask to hear the Lord and enter more deeply into relationship with him as we pray.

In the **First Reading** (Isaiah 8: 23–9:3), Isaiah foretells of the Lord coming among his people, describing him as a light who will guide them through darkness, easing their burden and bringing them joy.

The **Second Reading** (1 Cor. 1:10–13:17) is a heartfelt call for unity, made to the early church in Corinth. It is a timely reminder for today's Church that we are all united though the Good News we are called to proclaim. Christ is one and cannot be divided up: we are all one in him.

Isaiah's ancient prophecy of the Messiah as a light in the darkness is repeated in today's **Gospel** (Matthew 4: 12–23), where Matthew links it to the start of Jesus's mission. On hearing that John the Baptist has been arrested, Jesus sets out and begins to preach, using the same call to repentance as John did. Just as John had gathered a small group of followers, so Jesus invites the first of his disciples.

As we pray, let's remember that we, too, are called to follow Jesus. We do not pray alone but belong to a community of believers united by our baptism. We share the same hope of which the psalmist sang and are guided by the same light that Isaiah spoke of. May we seek and build the unity that Paul longed for.

<u>UKRAINIAN EMERGENCY WINTER APPEAL – BISHOP ALAN WRITES:</u> Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason a new Emergency Winter Appeal was launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which is suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis.

The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics (grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea coffee, biscuits, etc.)

It is hoped that £160,00 can be raised allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need and I ask that you and your parishioners will consider supporting this Emergency Winter Appeal. Funds can be remitted to:
