

Jesus, in his time, was a devout Jew who didn't shy away from addressing concerns with religious leaders, much like Malachi did. He emphasized the importance of faithfulness among these leaders, as their actions could influence others. Leaders must set a positive example and maintain a strong connection with God's love.

The readings for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, particularly the first reading from Malachi and the Gospel from Matthew, highlight this message. Malachi's admonition for religious leaders to uphold their faith and Matthew's caution against hypocrisy resonate with Jesus' teachings.

In simpler terms, Jesus, being a faithful Jew, urged leaders to walk the talk and stay true to their beliefs. He wanted them to avoid leading people astray. This lesson applies to leaders today as well: be genuine in faith, lead by example, and nurture your connection with God's love.

THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

November is the month when we remember and pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Catechism teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC 1030). So, November is an ideal time to help the Holy Souls in Purgatory through prayer and acts of love and charity. Our prayers will assist them on their journey to heaven, where they will assuredly pray us on our journey to God as well. November is also a good time to remember that we are sinners and that by God's grace we must strengthen our own souls so that we too may enter heaven.

<u>SUMMARY OF POPE FRANCIS' WEDNESDAY AUDIENCE ON APOSTOLIC</u> <u>ZEAL (5):</u>

Dear brothers and sisters: In our continuing catechesis on apostolic zeal, the burning desire to share the joy of the Gospel, we now turn to the role of the Holy Spirit, sent by Jesus on the day of Pentecost to inaugurate the mission of the Apostles to make disciples of all nations. In the early Church's great missionary outreach, the Holy Spirit appears as the driving force, preparing hearts to receive the Gospel and confirming the Apostles in their witness to the risen Lord. The momentous decision of the Council of Jerusalem not to require converts to observe the Mosaic law was the fruit of prayerful discernment and communicated with the formula, "it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us" (*Acts* 15:28). In every age, the Spirit illumines and guides the Church's proclamation of the Gospel. Today, Ash Wednesday, invites us to invoke the light of the Spirit upon our individual lives as followers of Christ and on the Church's mission of bringing the consolation of Jesus to the desolation of a world that thirsts for the justice, peace and reconciled unity which are the fruit of the Lord's passover from death to life at Easter.

<u>DIVORCE AND REMARRIAGE - AN EXCERPT FROM THE BRENTWOOD DIOCESAN DIRECTORY:</u>

'Divorce is not in itself a bar to receiving Holy Communion and the Church accepts that in some circumstances Catholics may need to initiate divorce proceedings to protect their rights in civil law. However, the Church presumes that all marriages are valid and bind until death, unless and until nullity is proven, or a dissolution of the bond on the grounds of nonconsummation, or in favour of the Faith is granted (where one or both parties was not baptised). A Catholic who marries outside the Church, without permission from the Bishop (dispensation from the canonical form of marriage), is still free in the eyes of the Church, because the Church's law has not been observed, but the appropriate documents must be produced to show this. However, Register Office marriage does bind non-Catholics (apart from Eastern Orthodox Christians). A priest cannot book a marriage when one of the parties has been divorced without proof that he or she is now canonically free.

Equally the Church cannot bless a marriage which she regards as invalid, and those who are in a marriage the Church considers irregular are not free to receive Holy Communion or absolution. A recent letter from the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith states: 'In fidelity to the words of Jesus Christ, the Church, affirms that a new union cannot be recognised as valid if the preceding marriage was valid. If the divorced are remarried civilly they can find themselves in a situation that objectively contravenes God's law. Consequently, they cannot receive Holy Communion as long as this situation persists.' The letter also recognises that this is a heavy burden, one that needs the support of the Catholic community including personal contact with one's parish priest. Anyone, Catholic or non-Catholic, wishing to enquire about the possibility of a declaration of nullity, or dissolution with regard to a former marriage, should initially contact the Brentwood Diocesan Tribunal Office for further information and help – 01277 265283.'

Please feel free to come and speak to Fr Mark if you need any advice.
