REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY



32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A – Page 91 12th November 2023

The common theme from the readings for the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A is the importance of wisdom and preparedness in our spiritual lives.

In the first reading, wisdom is described as something that doesn't fade and is found by those who seek it. Being wise in our choices and actions allows us to live a life more aligned with God's will. Wisdom is not just knowledge, but the ability to apply it in a way that brings peace and freedom from worry.

The second reading focuses on the hope we should have regarding the afterlife. It says not to grieve without hope for the departed, for they too will rise again. This is where wisdom comes into play again; a wise person doesn't just focus on the present but prepares for the future, including the afterlife.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the ten virgins to emphasize the need to be prepared and vigilant. The wise virgins brought extra oil, symbolizing their readiness to meet God. Like them, we must also prepare for the time when we will meet God, either at the end of our lives or at the Second Coming.

To sum it up, these readings urge us to seek wisdom and be prepared in our spiritual journey. Being wise and prepared helps us live a life in tune with God's plan and assures us a place in the heavenly feast.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY:

Remembrance Sunday falls on the Sunday nearest Armistice Day, 11 November, which marks the end of the First World War. On this day we remember all those who gave their lives for their country, all who suffered and died through acts of war and those who were left behind to grieve and mourn.

PRAYER:

O God, merciful and strong, who crush wars and cast down the proud, be pleased to banish violence swiftly from our midst and to wipe away all tears, so that we may all truly deserve to be called your children.

THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER:

November is the month when we remember and pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Catechism teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC 1030). So, November is an ideal time to help the Holy Souls in Purgatory through prayer and acts of love and charity. Our prayers will assist them on their journey to heaven, where they will assuredly pray us on our journey to God as well. November is also a good time to remember that we are sinners and that by God's grace we must strengthen our own souls so that we too may enter heaven.

ENVELOPES FOR HOLY SOULS:

The Envelopes for the Holy Souls are now available at the back of the church ready for the month of November when we remember and pray for all our loved ones who have gone before us. Please write the names of your loved ones who have died on a piece of paper and then place them in the envelope. Any money that you put in the envelope will be given to *Aid To The Church In Need* who will ensure that Masses for the Holy Souls are said in different churches around the world who are struggling financially. The lists of your loved ones will be placed in a basket at the foot of the altar during November. **Please hand the envelopes to Fr Mark or to the Parish office but please do not put them directly in the basket – as the money in them may be stolen.**

SUMMARY OF POPE FRANCIS' WEDNESDAY AUDIENCE ON APOSTOLIC ZEAL (6):

Dear brothers and sisters: In our catechesis on apostolic zeal, we now consider the ecclesial aspect of evangelization. The proclamation of the Gospel is not the task of isolated individuals, but a communal service to the Church's apostolic faith, which must be passed down in its integrity to every generation. Zeal for the spread of the Gospel is inseparable from this ecclesial dimension, which protects the Christian message from distortion and from accommodation to worldly interests and ways of thinking. The Vatican II Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity presents all evangelization as having its source in the immense love of God our Father, poured out on the world through the missions of the Son and the Holy Spirit, and prolonged in the Church's mission of proclaiming this saving love to all the ends of the earth. As "missionary disciples", all the baptized are called to imitate the self-sacrificing love of Christ by bearing creative and convincing witness to the truth of his word and its reconciling power, not only for individuals, but for the life of our entire human family.

SUMMARY OF POPE FRANCIS' ANGELUS MESSAGE ON 30TH SUNDAY OF YEAR (A):

Pope Francis focused on two dimensions to the Sunday Gospel reading that recounts when Jesus spoke about the duplicity in religious leaders of the time who "preach, but do not practice" and "do all their deeds to be seen by others." The gap between "saying and doing" and the emphasis on "the exterior over the interior" are aspects we need to look at in our own lives also, the Pope said in his reflections ahead of the Angelus prayer on Sunday.

Credible witnesses

Recalling how Jesus contested the duplicity of the lives of the religious leaders of his time, the Pope said this is something we also need to look at - the distance between saying and doing, preaching one thing but doing something else. He said we need to be on guard against this "duplicity of heart that puts at risk the authenticity of our witness and our credibility as persons and as Christians."

Practice what you preach

Given our own weaknesses, practicing what we preach is not always easy, the Pope acknowledged. And this is especially true when we hold a role of responsibility in life, the society or the Church. "To be teachers who are respected," he added, "we first need to be credible witnesses, as Saint Paul VI reminded us."

Looking good vs. being good

The second aspect follows as a consequence, he noted, the primary focus on the exterior rather than the interior. Pope Francis noted that many people seek to appear righteous, to "save face" by manifesting a beautiful exterior to hide the filth inside. "This is an awful sickness, especially for us Christians — when the exterior prevails over the interior," he said. "At times, even in the Church, we are tempted to save face, when we should be concerned about the interior so as to be consistent and credible Christians."

In conclusion, the Pope urged Christians to ask ourselves several questions about our own attitudes. "Do we try to practice what we preach, or do we live duplicitously? Are we concerned only about showing how impeccable we are on the outside, or do we also cultivate our interior life in sincerity of heart?"
