In the first reading from Isaiah today, on this 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, God promises to deliver and heal His people. He will turn barren landscapes into flourishing life. The eyes of the blind will be opened and the ears of the deaf unsealed. As Christians, we are called to trust in God's promises. When we face challenges, we remember that God has the power to bring healing and new life. Just as He promised to the people in Isaiah's time, He promises us the same today.

In the Gospel reading from Mark, Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech impediment. We can all suffer from spiritual deafness at times. Sometimes we don't want to hear God's voice or the opinions of others. Just as He healed the deaf man, Jesus can heal us, if we are open to him. To overcome our spiritual deafness, we need to spend more time in prayer. Listening to God, rather than just speaking, we need open our hearts to His spiritual healing. Jesus will heal us, if we humbly ask Him to do so.

Today, we ask the Lord to open our ears to hear His voice and our hearts to receive His inward grace. We ask him to guide us to live out our faith in all that we do. Amen.

Today marks the 176th celebration of Education Sunday for the Church in England and Wales. As we commence the beginning of a new academic year, let us entrust to Almighty God all who are involved in the provision of Catholic education in our schools, colleges and universities. We pray that Christ the Teacher will strengthen their faith and fill their hearts with courage and hope. Today, there will be a second collection for The Catholic Education Service.

Today, we are very happy to welcome Fr Frank Westcott to St Mary's as our new Assistant Priest. This is his first appointment as a priest, having only recently been ordained, so, please give him a big welcome and keep him in your prayers. We pray that he will soon feel at home and that his time here will be truly grace-filled.

POPE FRANCIS WED. GENERAL AUDIENCE ON VIRTUES AND VICES 8

In our reflections on the vices and virtues, we now consider *acedia* or *sloth*, which, although associated in English with laziness, is above all a deep spiritual apathy, manifested by discontent and aversion to attentive prayer and growth in our relationship with God. According to the monastic tradition, this "noonday devil" is best overcome by the patience of faith. This includes accepting the poverty or dark night of faith, which then enables us, by God's grace, to sense the divine presence and to continue to reach out to God. The saints themselves show us that perseverance in time of temptation leads us to set practical goals, however small, for our daily life and moves us to lean on Jesus, who always remains with us.

POPE FRANCIS Pope Francis has arrived in Jakarta at the start of the longest trip of his papacy and a tour that aims to showcase not only his affinity for the regions he will be visiting, but also his desire to advance the cause of peace and unity amid vast cultural and religious diversity. His overall trip from 2-13 September, including stops in Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, East Timor and Singapore, and will cover more than 20,000 km in total, all of which makes this the longest and most taxing international voyage done by the now 87-year-old pontiff during his 11-year papacy. Please pray for Pope Francis as he brings the Good News of Jesus Christ to this region.

<u>RELOCATION OF THE TABERNACLE</u> The work relating to the relocation of the tabernacle has begun this week, and is expected to take 3 to 4 weeks. Most services in the church will be unaffected by the work, apart from a limitation to the numbers of altar servers at Mass, the suspension of Adoration on Thursdays, and the Rosary after morning Mass.

The minimum expectations for the course are attendance at the Confirmation sessions and attendance at weekly Mass on Sunday or Saturday night. The Bishop will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on this occasion.
