**<u>29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time</u>** Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> October 2024 – Page 82

The first reading from Isaiah on this 29th Sunday in Ordinary time Year B describes a servant who suffers for others. This servant takes on pain and sorrow to bring healing and forgiveness. This passage points to Jesus, who willingly suffered to save us from our sins. Jesus's suffering was not in vain. By His wounds, we are healed. His sacrifice shows the depth of His love for us and calls us to love others in the same way. We are called to bear one another's burdens and share in their suffering. In our lives, we will face challenges and suffering. Following Jesus's example, we should embrace these moments as opportunities to grow in love and service. By doing so, we reflect the love of Christ to those around us.

In Mark's Gospel today, James and John ask Jesus for positions of honor. Jesus teaches them that true greatness comes from serving others. He came not to be served but to serve and give His life for many. Jesus's response turns worldly ideas of power and authority upside down. True leadership in the Kingdom of God is about humility and service, not seeking honor for oneself. He calls us to follow His example. This lesson challenges us to examine our desires and ambitions. Are we seeking personal glory, or are we willing to serve others selflessly? True greatness is found in humility and service, as shown by Jesus.

### WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

World Mission Sunday is celebrated in every Catholic community in the world. It's a moment of grace to express solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are living in situations of poverty, violence and oppression. Every parish, school and community is invited to join this special event, and every penny, pound and prayer you give to Missio (the Holy Father's official charity for overseas mission) helps missionaries everywhere continue their work. So, today, we pray in a special way for the missionary activity of the Church around the world. And, there'll be a second collection at the end of Mass for Missio.

### **OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE**

For us as Catholics, the legalisation of assisted suicide undermines the sanctity and dignity of human life. The Catholic Bishops are urging all Catholics to become better informed about the serious problems associated with the legalisation of assisted suicide and calling on Catholics in England and Wales to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose it (*there is a lot of information you can source on the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales website*). Catholics are asked to contact their MPs to voice their opposition to this latest attempt to legalise assisted suicide via a simple online mechanism made available by the charity Right to Life UK. It takes little more than a few minutes to input your postcode, make sure the suggested text suits your viewpoint and submit your message to ask your MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law – the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of the Bill in Parliament is 29<sup>th</sup> November.

# POPE FRANCIS WED. AUDIENCE ON VIRTUES AND VICES 13 - JUSTICE

Dear brothers and sisters: In our continuing catechesis on the virtues, we now turn to justice, which the Catechism describes as "the constant and firm will to give their due to God and neighbour" (No. 1807). Justice is not only a virtue to be practiced by individuals; it is above all a social virtue, for it is directed to the creation of communities in which each person is treated in accordance with his or her innate dignity. Justice is thus the basis of peace. The practice of justice demands the practice of other virtues, such as honesty, integrity, respect for law and commitment to the common good. Jesus calls blessed those who hunger and thirst for righteousness (cf. Mt 5:6). How greatly our world, riven by war and manifest inequality, needs men and women firmly committed to the pursuit of justice, so that the human family can live and flourish in unity, solidarity and peace.

<u>AUNTUMN MASS COUNT 2024</u>: We have just completed a count over the last 4 weekends of the number of people who have attended Mass here at St Mary's. The average weekend total for our 4 Sunday Masses was 890 which is an increase from our Autumn Mass Count last year of 809, but we are still down on our pre-Covid figures of just over 1,000. There's still work to be done, but by God's grace and our witness, we pray that we can draw more people back to church.

<u>**CHURCH CLEANING:**</u> Church cleaning takes place on Friday mornings from 10am and we are always looking for more helpers. *Our Lady will be with you as you help to keep clean the house of her Son.* 

**CONFIRMATION PRAYER PARTNERS:** Our young people will be starting their faith journey through Confirmation which will take place on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2025.
