In the first reading for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B from Daniel 12:1-3, we hear about a time of great distress. This passage tells us about the final judgment, where those who are wise will shine brightly, and those who lead others to righteousness will be like stars forever. It encourages us to live wisely and help others follow God's ways. This reading reminds us that we will face a final judgment. Our actions and choices matter, and we should strive to live according to God's will. We are called to lead others to righteousness and to be a light in the world. As we reflect on this, we should examine our lives. Are we living wisely? Are we helping others find their way to God? This reading challenges us to be mindful of our actions and their impact on others.

In the Gospel reading from Mark 13:24-32, Jesus speaks about the coming of the Son of Man during a time of great tribulation. He describes signs in the heavens and on earth, but He also assures us that His words will never pass away. This passage reminds us of the hope we have even in difficult times. Jesus' words give us hope and strength. Even when things seem chaotic and uncertain, we know that He is in control. His promise to return gives us a future to look forward to. Reflecting on this Gospel, we can find comfort in Jesus' words. We are reminded that no matter how hard things get, we have hope in His return. This should encourage us to keep our faith strong and trust in His promises.

NEW LECTIONARIES AND NEW PARISH MASS BOOKS

A new edition of the Lectionary, the book which contains the readings which are proclaimed at Mass, will come into use in England and Wales on the First Sunday of Advent 2024 (Sunday 1st December). It will use the *English Standard Version—Catholic Edition* of the Bible for the scripture readings and the *Abbey Psalms and Canticles* for the Responsorial Psalms. This also means that we will have new Parish Mass books from the first Sunday of Advent.

<u>JUBILEE YEAR 2025 – PILGRIMS OF HOPE:</u> The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope", and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis. The 2025 Jubilee year will officially open on 24th December, 2024 with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square.

LOURDES PILGRIMAGE 2025: We have been invited by the Parishes of Leigh-on-Sea and Southend to join them on the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes to mark the Jubilee year. This group is part of the overall Diocesan Pilgrimage, but it arranges its own accommodation through a Tour Operator called Anam Cara Travel. This means that the package is cheaper than the Diocesan Pilgrimage and we can stay at the very nice 4 star *Grande Hotel Moderne Soubirous* (closest to the Sanctuary). However, even though the cost is less than the main pilgrimage, however, it still works out at £895 (per person sharing) for a 5-night package from Monday 21st July to Saturday 26th July. At the moment, I am trying to gauge interest. If you are interested, please email the parish office by Monday 2nd December and we will send you more information. I am not sure how many places are available, so it will be a case of first come first served.

SECOND COLLECTION: Next weekend there will be a second collection for World Youth Sunday, money raised will go towards Walsingham House and BCYS who support the youth in our Diocese.

<u>OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE:</u> For us as Catholics, the legalisation of assisted suicide undermines the sanctity and dignity of human life. The Catholic Bishops are urging all Catholics to become better informed about the serious problems associated with the legalisation of assisted suicide and calling on Catholics in England and Wales to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose it. Catholics are asked to contact their MPs to voice their opposition to this latest attempt to legalise assisted suicide via a simple online mechanism made available by the charity Right to Life UK. It takes little more than a few minutes to input your postcode, make sure the suggested text suits your viewpoint and submit your message to ask your MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law – the 2nd reading of the Bill in Parliament is 29th November.

THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER: November is the month when we remember and pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Catechism teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC 1030). So, November is an ideal time to help the Holy Souls in Purgatory through prayer and acts of love and charity. Our prayers will assist them on their journey to heaven, where they will assuredly pray us on our journey to God as well. November is also a good time to remember that we are sinners and that by God's grace we must strengthen our own souls so that we too may enter heaven. Envelopes for the Holy Souls are available at the back of the church. Write the names of your deceased loved ones on a piece of paper and put it in the envelope. Any donations will be given to Aid To The Church In Need for Masses to be said for the Holy Souls. Please hand the envelopes to Fr Mark or to the Parish office.
