THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Sunday 12th January 2025 – Page 118

In the Baptism of the Lord Year C, we reflect on the special event of Jesus' baptism. Jesus, though sinless, chose to be baptized by John the Baptist, who called people to repent. Why did Jesus, who had no need to repent, decide to be baptized?

One reason is that Jesus wanted to show his support and understanding for us. He wanted to share in our humanity and weaknesses. By being baptized, Jesus stood with those who were seeking forgiveness and a new start. He showed that he was not distant from us but very close, sharing in our struggles.

Another reason is that Jesus' baptism was a way to begin his mission. It was a public sign that he was ready to do God's work. The heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit came down like a dove. A voice from heaven said, "You are my beloved Son; with you, I am well pleased." This showed that Jesus was chosen by God for a special purpose.

Through Jesus' baptism, we see how much God loves us. Jesus showed that he is with us in our joys and our difficulties. He came to save us and to show us the way to God. By being baptized, Jesus showed that he was one of us, sharing in everything we go through. And through our own baptism, we start to share in Jesus' life; the Holy Spirit is poured into our hearts so that se become children of God, sharing in Divine life and able to call God 'Abba' Father.

POPE FRANCIS WED. AUDIENCE ON 'THE SPIRIT AND THE BRIDE' 3

Today, in our continuing catechesis on the Holy Spirit and the Bride, we reflect on the action of the Holy Spirit in Divine Revelation, specifically in Sacred Scripture. God, who inspired Scripture, in turn inspires the Church, the Bride of Christ, through his holy word, making of her its authoritative interpreter. The Spirit also communicates with us personally within this ecclesial reality, whether through *lectio divina*, which is a meditative reading of a Scripture passage, or above all, in the Liturgy. In whatever the setting, there is always one word that is meant especially for us. Like a musical composition, Sacred Scripture carries throughout an underlying theme, which Saint Augustine and Saint Gregory the Great call God's love. May we "learn to know the heart of God through the words of God" and allow them to breathe that love into our daily lives.

JUBILEE YEAR – PILGRIMS OF HOPE

On Sunday 29th December, the Feast of the Holy Family, Bishop Alan inaugurated the Holy Year in the diocese during the 11.30 Mass at the Cathedral. The theme for the Holy Year is Pilgrims of Hope.

In the Diocese of Brentwood Holy Doors will be opened in-

- The Cathedral of St Mary & St Helen, Brentwood,
- The National Shrine of Our Lady of Light, Spouse of the Holy Spirit, Clacton,
- Saint Antony of Padua, Forest Gate.

The Bishop explained that in Acts of the Apostles we hear how God opens doors of faith to gentiles and others. The astonishing truth at the heart of every successful Holy Year is that we can learn through experience that God's mercy and forgiveness are always utterly generous. When pilgrims walk through a Holy Door- a door of faith- we will be astonished about how straightforward our reconciliation with God is- 'Almighty God... in this year of grace...bound to Christ the rock of our salvation, may we happily attain the goal of blessed hope'.
