"In a spirit of profound adoration of the Most Holy Trinity, we join all the saints who eternally celebrate the heavenly liturgy, to offer thanks again with them to our God for the wonders he has accomplished in the history of salvation... for having raised up in the Church a great multitude of saints, whom no one could count. A great multitude: not only the saints and blesseds we honour during the liturgical year, but also the anonymous saints known only to him. Mothers and fathers of families, who in their daily devotion to their children made an effective contribution to the Church's growth and to the building of society; priests, sisters and lay people who, like candles lit before the altar of the Lord, were consumed in offering material and spiritual aid to their neighbour in need; men and women missionaries, who left everything to bring the Gospel message to every part of the world." (Pope St John Paul II)

Today, we celebrate and give thanks for all the Saints in heaven and, for the rest of the month of November, we remember and pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Catechism teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (CCC 1030). So, November is an ideal time to help the Holy Souls in Purgatory through prayer and acts of love and charity. Our prayers will assist them on their journey to heaven, where they will assuredly pray for us on our journey to God as well. November is also a good time to remember that we are sinners and that by God's grace we must strengthen our own souls so that we too may enter heaven.

Envelopes for the Holy Souls are available at the back of the church. Write the names of your deceased loved ones on a piece of paper and put it in the envelope. Any money that you put in the envelope will be given to Aid To The Church In Need who will ensure that Masses for the Holy Souls are said in different churches around the world who are struggling financially. The lists of your loved ones will be placed in a basket at the foot of the altar during November. Please hand the envelopes to Fr Mark or to the Parish office, but please do not put them directly in the basket. We also invite you to bring a photo of your loved ones who have died, so that we can put them up in the church as a way of remembering them.

<u>ST JOHN HENRY NEWMAN – DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH:</u> Pope Leo XIV has officially declared St John Henry Newman, the most recently canonised saint from England and Wales, the 38th Doctor of the Church. A 'Doctor of the Church' is a man or woman of great holiness and learning whose teaching and wisdom not only resonated with their own contemporaries, but still illuminates, instructs and inspires today. Very few people in the history of the Church have been given this title, beginning with some of the early Church Fathers like St Ambrose and St Augustine, up until St Thérèse of Lisieux. They are now joined by St John Henry Newman.

KNOW YOUR FAITH CORNER

The Meaning of Sunday Worship

Sunday worship holds a central place in the life of every Christian. It is not merely a day of rest or a weekly routine. It is the "Lord's Day", the day when we commemorate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, who rose from the dead on the first day of the week (cf. Mk 16:2, Lk 24:1). From the earliest days of the Church, Christians have gathered on Sundays to celebrate the Eucharist, listen to the Word of God, and renew their communion with Christ and one another. This weekly gathering reminds us that our faith is not lived in isolation but within the Body of Christ, the Church.

Sunday is also a day of joy, thanksgiving, and renewal, if you like, a weekly Easter, when we are called to rest from work and focus on God, family, and spiritual growth. By keeping Sunday holy, we affirm that God is the centre of our lives and that time itself belongs to Him. The Catechism of the Church teaches us that Sunday is "the pre-eminent day of the liturgical assembly" and the "foundation and kernel of the whole liturgical year". (cf. CCC 1193, 2174–2185). So, Make Sunday a true celebration of life in Christ. Come to Mass, rejoice, and carry that joy into the week ahead. – Fr. Jude
