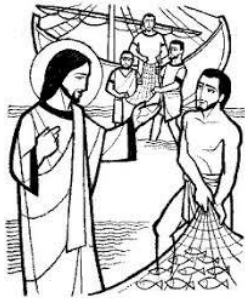

The 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B 24th January 2021

Lord teach me your paths.

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time marks the ‘Sunday of the Word of God’, instituted by Pope Francis in 2019 as an annual celebration of the gift of Scripture. It encourages us to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, shaping how we are called to live and to relate to each other.

In the same way, the readings for this Sunday call us to follow the Lord’s ways. This may involve some change of priorities and direction for us as we seek to move towards the kingdom of God ourselves.

In the **First Reading** (Jonah 3: 1–5,10), we see God show mercy to the people of Nineveh. They renounce their evil ways in response to Jonah preaching the word of God. At the beginning of St Mark’s **Gospel** (Mark 1: 14–20), again we hear of people changing their ways. Jesus begins his ministry by finding and inviting the first disciples to leave their work as fishermen and follow him for greater things.

Although the **Second Reading** (1 Corinthians 7: 29–31) sounds challenging, its intention is to encourage us to live in a way that is guided by the love of Christ and shows our faith and hope in the kingdom of God. We are called to live in open freedom and detachment – it is who we are, not what we have, that counts.

Perhaps during this coming week, I can pray for the grace to be open to any change the Lord asks me to make, so that I can respond better to his call and be ready to go wherever he is asking me.

Vaccines against COVID-19: The Bishops of England & Wales are encouraging all to take up the offer of the vaccine when it is offered. Pope Francis will receive his vaccine this week. He said that ethically, getting a vaccine against the virus should be a duty for everyone *“It is an ethical option because you risk your health, your life, but you also risk the lives of others...it is something one must do”*.

Fr Ticão: Some of you may remember the visit to St Mary's in 2000 by Fr Ticão and some of his parishioners from the parish of São Francisco de Assis in São Paulo, which we supported as a twin parish for years. Sadly, Fr Ticão (actually Fr Antonio Luiz Marchioni) died on New Year's Day in Santa Marcelina Itaquera Hospital at the age of 68. For years he had been parish priest of the Parish of São Francisco de Assis, São Paulo and was known for his social work, mainly in the East zone of São Paulo.
